Access to safe water and sanitation contributes to improved health, helps prevent the spread of infectious disease, and reduces child and maternal mortality rates.

Eight out of 10 people without access to improved water sources live in rural areas. From the start, that's where we've focused our efforts.



We believe the best solutions are designed locally, so we work through implementing partners

We partner with local schools that strongly align with our mission,



We aim for the long-term sustainability of our education projects

Our scholarship program directly supports the education of primary and secondary in Zimbabwe not only with funding but also with supplemental summer courses.



We target areas of high need and low income where we can work in a concentrated geography for multiple years

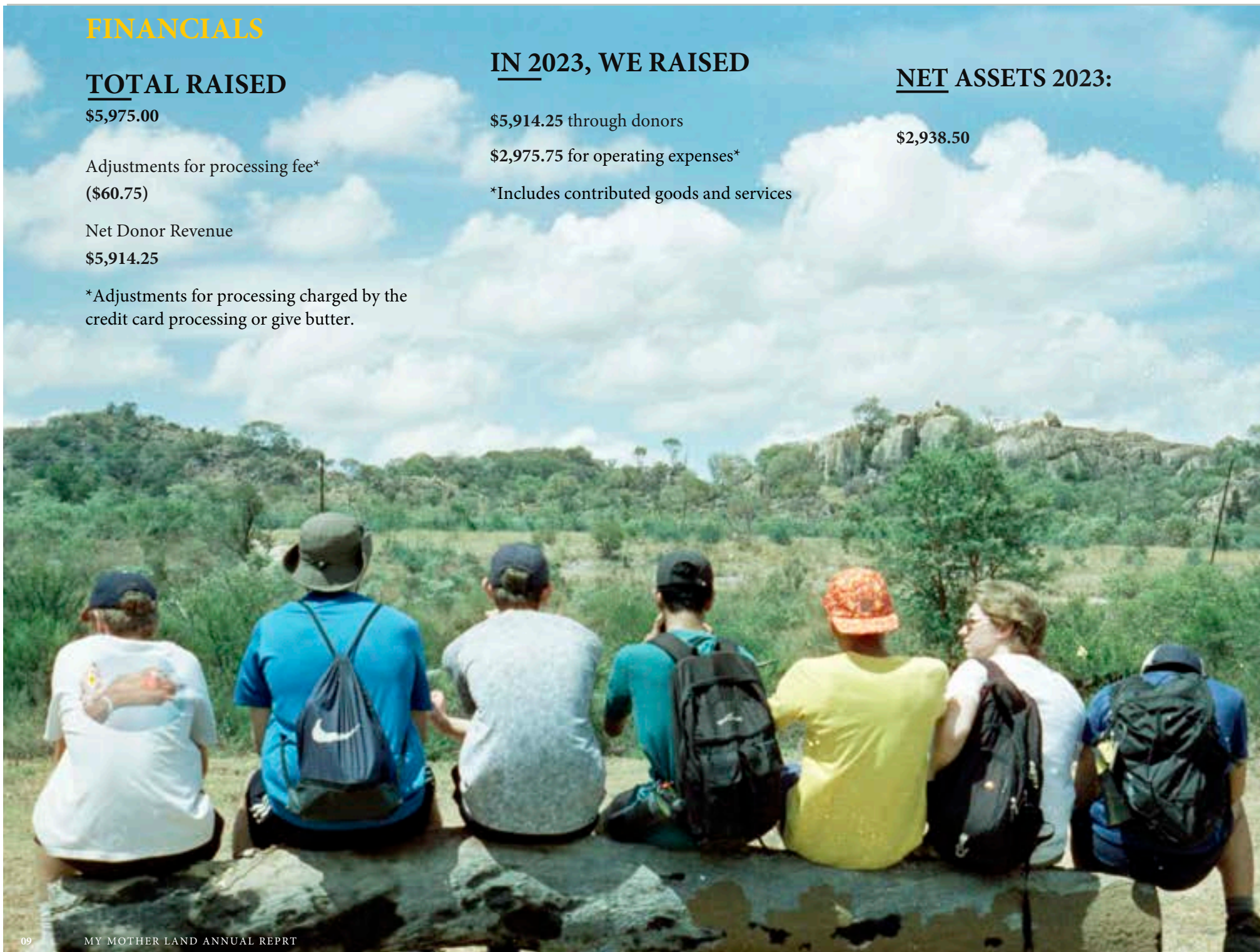

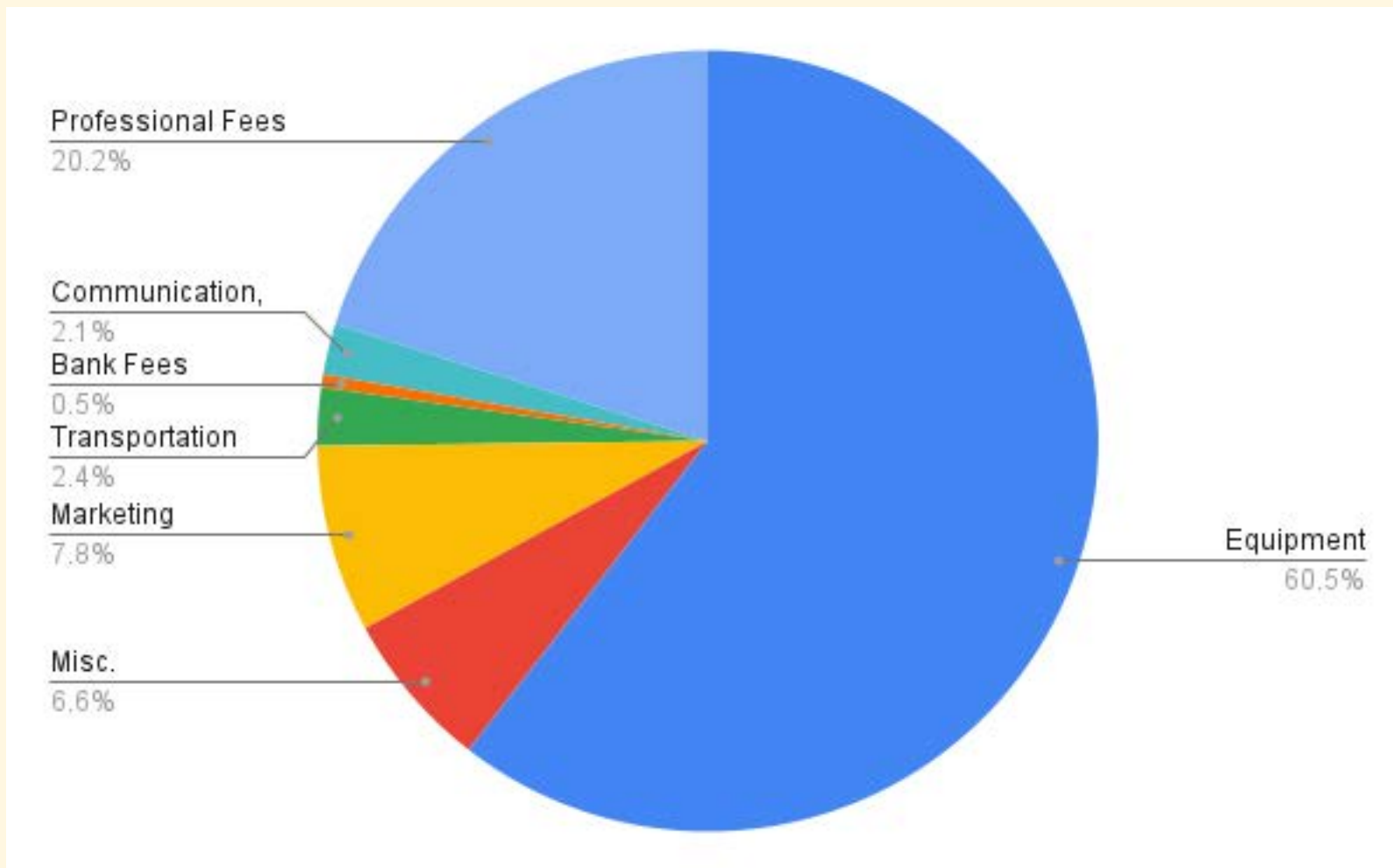
